

Measles causes red spots and mumps causes lumps. But influenza, a serious viral infection, leaves no such telltale signs. “The flu” causes tens of thousands of hospitalizations each year. Some kids even die from it. The *Childhood Influenza Immunization Coalition (CIIC)* urges annual vaccination for children 6 months through 18 years of age, as recommended by the CDC. It’s also important that family and close contacts get vaccinated to reduce the risk of giving influenza to others.
